The APA thought he had a neurological issue due to some fly biting and shadow chasing but he's gone through significant testing with the vet and it was ultimately concluded that those are due to boredom.

He's potty trained, can sit, stay, and come. He likes to give you a paw or hugs. He's healthy and has come a long way since we've had him. He's good with our other dog.

Jumps on people in a loving way but can some times be too much. He has some fear aggression that needs more specialized behavioral training. He needs grooming and intimate touch exposure/training. Because of the fear aggression incidents, our other dog is becoming more protective over us and I think this is further stressing Andy. We aren't able to provide him the exercise and additional training that he needs.
